Field Officer, Nutrition for Life

Background

The Lifesaving Nutrition for Life project aims to protect vulnerable women and children in five high-burden districts in Nepal – Banke, Bardiya of Lumbini and Siraha, Saptari and Sarlahi of Madhesh. The program will deliver essential health and nutrition services—including screening and treatment for acute malnutrition, maternal and newborn nutrition support, and vitamin A supplementation—while strengthening the skills of health workers, community volunteers, and local health facilities. By reaching children under five, pregnant women, and high-risk infants, the project seeks to prevent a worsening child survival crisis and safeguard families from malnutrition and mortality.

Position Overview

The Field Officer will work closely with the implementing partner at the district level to ensure that all planned activities are executed in alignment with Helen Keller's standards, maintaining both quality and timeliness. The Field Officer will also be responsible for coordinating with government authorities and other key stakeholders to facilitate smooth implementation and promote local leadership and ownership of the program.

Functional Relationships

Under the direct supervision of the Province Manager, the Field Officer will be responsible for the technical assistance to the implementing partners and the coordination at district and local level. This role requires subject-matter expertise, along with strong coordination, networking, representation, and communication skills.

Key Responsibilities:

- Provide technical support to partner NGOs and health institutions to implement project activities.
- Provide administrative support to the Project Coordinator and team of the partner NGOs and assist in the overall management of the project activities.
- Provide technical assistance to help with program planning, scheduling, and documentation, ensuring that program activities are well-organized and executed.
- Facilitate communication among program stakeholders, including team members, partners, and external parties. They schedule and coordinate meetings, prepare agendas, and ensure that relevant information is shared in a timely manner.
- Assists on preparing program reports, compilation, and communication of program status to Province Manager.
- Communicate with implementing partner on implementation modality, quality and timely delivery of program.
- Coordinate with program team members and provide support as needed.
- Provide training and capacity building to partners and local stakeholders to execute project activities.
- Collaborate closely with implementing partners to ensure effective mobilization of the Program Coordinator, Data Management Officer, and Nutrition Facilitators at the field level.
- Experience using Excel, Word, and Power Point and other applicable software.
- Demonstrable respect for all people regardless of religion, ethnicity, class, or gender, with a high comfort level working in a diverse environment with a demonstrated commitment to high professional ethical standards.
